(b) 17/00445/FUL

The Golden Pot Eversley Centre

Erection of a two storey, 14 bed motel accommodation, to the rear of the Golden Pot Pub, with car parking and associated external works.

EPC Consultee response: EPC objects to this application on the following grounds:

- 1. The culverting of the ditch this is an important water course and culverting it would reduce its capacity and could lead to flooding.
- Even with the parking spaces over the ditch this would only make 1 or 2 more spaces
 than are there at the moment. There will also potentially be more staff as well as
 additional customers who will require parking and therefore will the parking spaces be
 sufficient.
- 3. The landscape impact of removing all the green hedgerow ad soft landscaping will open up the area considerably.
- There will be an environmental impact from the additional traffic. Unless there are restrictions in terms of time then there will be disturbances to immediate neighbours and anyone nearby.
- 5. The scale is out of keeping and will dwarf the existing building.
- 6. There are problems with the whole of the sewerage system in this area. Adding 14 more toilets and showers ought to be a consideration.
- 7. EPC feels that the Golden Pot should either be recorded as locally listed or a community asset.

Section 116 Highways Act 1980

Land adj. Willow House, Reading Road,

The Chairman explained that this land does not belong to Willow House they just have a cultivation licence over it and is responsible for maintaining the surface but it is land for recreation by residents. If Highways Rights are removed then EPC could ask for it to be registered as Village Green. The owner of Willow House cannot own the land as it has been designated as recreation ground under an Enclosure Award by an Act of parliament. If Highway rights were removed then the home owner would have no right to drive over it to his property. It is not EPC's land but the public have a right to use is as Highway and as recreation area. There would be a public advantage to having it registered as Village Green but would be no advantage to the public having Highway Rights.

Councillors suggested that the home owner may not be aware of this situation and offered to speak with him.

(iii) Other Planning Matters

<u>Local Plan</u> The Draft Local Plan is out for consultation with responses requested by 9th June 2017. There are 2 public exhibitions to be held locally. 8th May at Victoria Hall, Hartley Wintney and 10th May at The Tythngs Yateley. It is proposing 124 houses in Eversley and another 88 on the Eversley/Yateley border which is actually in Eversley. The Chairman had attended a meeting regarding the local plan where they had confirmed that they would have a phasing policy in place. It was unclear whether the proposed Marsh Lane development would count as part of these numbers or not and EPC is seeking clarification. It was noted that there is also a pre-application for 10 houses on Warbrook Lane.

Min 210: Min 190: Burial Ground Cllr P Todd is awaiting contact with Ron Rietdyk.

Min 210: Min 190: <u>Public Right of Way Evidence Regarding Warren Heath</u> Cllr P Todd has yet to write a covering letter, which will explain the claim clearly, and to find the maps from the Forestry Commission to complete the paperwork.

Min 210: Min 190: <u>Heritage Assets</u> EPC is concerned that since Firgrove Manor now had individual house owners there is a possibility that the gardens may be divided up rather than remaining as communal which would be a threat to the historic gardens. Cllr P Todd had yet to draft a request to HDC to step up protection, by way of an Article 4 Direction to remove Permitted Development Rights in the gardens of Firgrove Manor.

Cllr D Bradley thanked the Clerk for producing it so quickly and to all Councillors who helped in its distribution. Many Councillors had received favourable comments on the content and quality of the newsletter.
